**COVID-19 CONCERNS** 

We continue to shelter in place, which means that the Temple will remain closed for all events and activities until further notice to protect everyone; notice of any change will be communicated as soon as we know it. Please do not come to the Temple.

Meantime, we are continuing to reach out to members by phone, email and text, and will offer opportunities for our community to gather virtually by phone and online, and to share Shabbat services. I will also be announcing some educational upcoming events online – I invite you to join me for those.

Please follow all the guidelines and exercise caution: shelter in place as much as possible, wash your hands frequently, avoid touching your face, limit physical contact (hugging, kissing, hand shaking), remain at a social distance (six feet) from others, cover your mouth and nose if you cough or sneeze, wash clothing in the hottest water setting that they can tolerate, sanitize surfaces using cleaners that include disinfectants, and sanitize groceries or other items you bring into your home.

If you are feeling ill, please remain at home and avoid others, unless it is severe and you need medical attention – in which case contact your physician, and follow their advice.

If you are having difficulties getting groceries or medicine, please call the Rabbi at 304-989-4014, or email <u>rabbijoeb@gmail.com</u>.

If you are feeling any need or simply wish to talk, please know that the Rabbi is available, and will arrange a phone call or private zoom meeting with you if you let him know.

### Short Message from the Rabbi

At this point, we are all looking at the situation, and wondering when we are ever going to get back to 'normal.' This is a trying time, and a difficult situation; more so for some than others. Please know that you are not alone or forgotten, we care very much about you and want to know how you are doing. I will continue to offer the "Check In' telephone calls and zoom meetings weekly, and make myself available one-on-one for calls or video meetings , and continue to read and respond to emails and texts. You are welcome to be in touch in a way that works for you.

I want to express my appreciation to those who have spoken with me about supporting my efforts to reach out to those who have been or will be impacted indirectly by the Pandemic, not by the illness itself, but through consequences of the ripple effects of loss of employment or income, exacerbation of other unrelated illnesses, deterioration in living situations, and through a lack of - or increase in negative social and familial relationships.

We are all looking forward to a return to "normal" – we hope very soon. Once that is announced, we will re-institute our regular calendar of events in the Temple building, but we will act wth caution and prudently to avoid all unnecessary risks to our members and staff.

Meantime, remember to wash your hands and avoid contact with anyone who may be ill. Stay healthy!
