MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

Shalom & greetings!

I am sitting in the rabbi's office in the Temple, looking over the list of all the events, meetings, activities, services, and classes planned, and pleased at the large number of things we are able to accomplish, even while continuing to observe social distancing. I am happy to say that we have been able to continue functioning in almost all ways despite the Pandemic causing us to close the building and stop meetings in person. Committee and Board meetings, Sisterhood meetings, classes, conversations and check ins - so much is going on. It is a testament to the vitality and vibrancy of our congregation and community. Kol Hakavod to all of you for adapting and coping with all the changes, challenges, and impositions that have come our way.

The only thing that is truly lacking (and which I certainly miss sorely) is the opportunity to see you in person – but until it is safe and prudent, we are limited to electronic communication. At the same time, we continue to work on ways to make that feel less distant and more natural. (I am still hoping to find a way to share food through Zoom. (5)

To that end, this week we are beginning an experiment: trying out a new format for our Shabbat service, using Zoom, allowing congregants to enter the meeting room for the service starting at ~5 pm on Friday, enabling everyone to talk via zoom with each other. When we come to 5:30, we will mute everyone for the duration of the service, and David Stern, Bob Morris, and I will conduct the service in the sanctuary just as if everyone was there, and you will be able to watch and participate via zoom (I will be hoping to see you singing along on the screen!). We will also unmute everyone at the end of the service, so we have a chance to chat, and wish each other a Shabbat Shalom. Though it is an imperfect substitute for actually gathering, it is a step closer to being able to be together and socialize. We will continue to refine the process, making it better each week – until we can once again hold services in person.

Returning to the purpose of this email: the rest of this message covers planned events and activities of Temple Israel in the next few weeks for the month of July 2020, including current/updated Temple news, information, and a bit of what is going on to help keep us connected and informed. It is being sent in lieu of a bulletin. We are looking into producing some hard copy mailings as well; and we will return to producing a bulletin as soon as we can. We want to serve you in as many ways and as well as it is possible.

COVID-19 CONCERNS

This is a work in progress, and no one can give a date when we will be 'past' all the restrictions. Just know that we are doing the best we can and keeping your well-being in mind at all times, and trying to find ways to connect with and support you.
