SPECIAL MESSAGE

As the new year approaches, we are again taking stock of Sisterhood's activities in the community. There are many individual acts of tzedaka to these organizations, but also as a group. We support some community programs that serve those who are homeless and/or displaced.

The Peak Center for Veterans has 60 drop-ins a day and guides numerous veterans to independence. They are in 7 apartments and other arrangements. They need 25 sets of twin bedding, towels, personal care items, etc.

Sojourners is currently serving 60 women, 10 children, and 9 men in different family make-ups. They desperately need shampoo, conditioner, soap, and detergent.

Please be generous in your giving of supplies. We will be collecting items at the Temple over the High Holidays.

Items can always be left at the Temple, and Sisterhood will deliver them.


