#### FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

#### Shalom & greetings!

I suspect it will come as no surprise to you that I am once again surprised that it is already time to write the Summer (June-July-August) Bulletin. It has felt to me that this year has flown past. Trying to get into my mind that this is looking ahead at a three-month window is a challenge, but I will give it a try!

I am pleased and honored to have been informed that the Board of Trustees, at their last meeting in May, approved the Employment Agreement proposed by the Committee, to effect continuation of my service as rabbi of Temple Israel. The extension of my service in that role (but not the contract itself) will be presented for ratification to the Congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting on June 4th, and I most fervently hope that it will receive a positive response. I am looking forward to working with you, and to have the privilege to continue to serve as rabbi at Temple Israel.

- As I write this, we are just about to observe L"ag B'Omer and Pesach Sheni in the Shabbat service with Torah from Parashah Emor.
- The Board of Trustees held their May meeting, and the materials for the Annual Congregational Meeting on June 4<sup>th</sup> are being prepared – and may reach you before this Bulletin.
- We will hold our Shavuot service in just two weeks.
- The Third Annual Indoor Picnic Oneg is in mid-June (please RSVP), as is the WV Jewish Film Festival (6/15, 1:00 p.m. Marquee Cinemas).

- The Passover Seder on April 12<sup>th</sup>
  was an absolutely lovely evening,
  and a great success.
- A sad event recently was the funeral for Marion Baer on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, many attended and it was a comfort to see so many there to honor her.
- The Community Yom HaShoah service on April 23<sup>rd</sup> was a moving event. I appreciate Rabbi Urecki

- working with me to make this happen.
- Our Yom HaZikaron/Yom
   Ha'Atzma'ut service on May 2<sup>nd</sup> felt
   both stirring and reflective. It was
   sobering to commemorate these
   historical events in the context of all
   that is currently taking place.
- Sisterhood Shabbat on May 9<sup>th</sup> was lovely, and included participation by many members of Sisterhood.
- The WVU OLLI Course, The Akedah in Story and Midrash, took place on May 7<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>, and was very well received.
- Courses continued to meet, as they will through June: Jewish Literature, A Bisell Torah, Torah Study, Death Chatter, and the Torah at 10 and Talmud at 10 classes (co-taught with Rabbi Urecki). Recently, all of these classes have been interesting and lively.
- Sisterhood held their Board of Directors and General Membership meeting on April 27<sup>th</sup>, with an interesting program on fraud from AARP.
- Sisterhood Schmoozes continued to be lively gatherings and discussions.
- Board of Trustees and Committee meetings continued as planned, carrying on the work of the congregation.
- The last regular Board of Trustees meeting for the current congregational year took place on May 13<sup>th</sup>; they will next meet on September 9<sup>th</sup>, absent a call for a special meeting.

time, with the formal meeting to begin promptly at 5:30 p.m. to conduct the business of the congregation.

Members in good standing should receive a packet of materials by postal mail for the Annual Meeting in advance of it.

- A Bissell Torah will meet through June as scheduled at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday afternoons.
- An "indoor picnic" is scheduled on June 13<sup>th</sup> as the Oneg Shabbat for that week. Please RSVP. I look forward to seeing you there!
- Courses and classes will go on summer break; if not listed on the calendar or website, it is pretty safe to assume that they are not being held during the summer months.
   Watch for announcements that they are starting up again in the Fall – and look for information about some new classes that will make an appearance in the Fall, as well.
- July 4<sup>th</sup> is a Thursday, and the office is closed that day.
- In August, we will hold services as usual. No special events at Temple Israel are noted now. Do hold the dates of August 9-10 to join in the celebration of Rabbi and Marilyn Urecki's retirement after many years of service to B'nai Jacob and the Jewish Community.
- At this point, September's calendar is similar to August, until we have a chance to add events to the list. I do note that the week of the 21<sup>st</sup> of September includes the Holiday of Rosh Hashanah and Shabbat Shuvah.
- High Holidays this year begin with Erev Rosh Hashanah on Monday evening, September 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7:30 p.m. Rosh Hashanah will continue with the morning service on September 23<sup>rd</sup> at 10:30 a.m., immediately followed by a Tashlich service in the Temple Foyer.
- The Shabbat service on September 26<sup>th</sup> will be Shabbat Shuvah, preparing us for the upcoming holiday of Yom Kippur (more on that in the next Bulletin).

Also, if you are willing, we invite you to participate in services by leading a prayer (or perhaps several) or doing a reading (or several) during the service; being called up for an Aliyah to the Torah; serving as Gabbai for the Torah Service; or giving a devar Torah (sermon).

If you are interested in doing any of these, please be in touch with me (the Rabbi), and we can select a date that works for you, as well as the role that you would like to take on.

We would be happy to have you participate in a way that you wish, and we will work with you to assure it is possible.

#### MUSINGS

As I said in the last Bulletin, may we continue our measured progress through the period of the counting of the Omer, leading us to Shavuot. May we find meaning, purpose, and spiritual nourishment in the counting and recounting of these days, and take into our hearts the Sefirot (Emanations or Attributes of the Divine) that we use as markers to keep track of our inner journey and the progress we hope to achieve during this time. May we arrive at Shavuot in a state of readiness and openness, so that we may once again merit the gifts of Torah and Revelation that the holiday represents. May our summer period begin with that as a spiritual high.

May the Three Weeks, starting with the fast day on the 17<sup>th</sup> of Tamuz (falling on Sunday July 13<sup>th</sup>) and running to Tisha B'Av (the 9<sup>th</sup> day of the month of Av, falling on August 3<sup>rd</sup>) help us to find the strength and will to do what we believe is both good and right to bring about a better world and to rebuild the relationship and the covenant between us and our G-d.

May the holiday of Tu B'Av (the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month of Av, falling on the 9<sup>th</sup> of August) allow us to see and feel all the love that surrounds us.

May the arrival of the month of Elul on August 24<sup>th</sup>, our annual call to focus inwards and upwards, stir us to redirect ourselves and choose the path that is right for us.

May all of these events and times work within and upon us to raise our spirits, rekindle our sense of purpose, fill us with hope and optimism, heighten our awareness of joy, and open our eyes to the wonders, miracles, and blessings among which we walk each day.

May we each be blessed with joys, health, and a life filled with deeds of lovingkindness, and may we be granted many blessings and a sense of fulfillment, so that we may enter the upcoming year from a position of accomplishment and success.

#### THOUGHTS, BLESSINGS & SALUTATIONS

As we enter the summer and the slightly more leisurely period on the congregational calendar, may you find time to take in the natural beauty of our surroundings, enjoy the pleasant weather, and engage in activities that bring you pleasure, with people you love.
