FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Shalom & greetings! Welcome to the September Bulletin!

As I announced at our Annual meeting, I pledged to keep the Congregation informed of any developments in that regard. I am pleased to report that our Board of Trustees had a joint meeting with the B'nai Jacob Board to discuss and outline the steps necessary to decide on how this consolidation may take shape. Both Boards believed that the discussion was very productive and pledged to continue those efforts during this next year.

In addition, the Steering Committee created by my predecessor, Gayle Twigger-Shaw, has created several subgroups dedicated to the most important issues which we need to resolve prior to consolidation - finance, religious practices, governance, programs, social action and facilities. Our Finance Committee has met with B'nai Jacob's committee to exchange financial information, and we plan to have the other above committees meet soon with their B'nai Jacob counterparts.

I should reiterate that nothing can or will be done respecting consolidation without the entire Congregation being fully informed of the details and affirmatively voting to approve. In the meantime, please feel free to ask me or any of the Board of Trustees members any questions you may have as the process unfolds.

I look forward to our High Holiday celebration and the other exciting and rewarding events planned for the upcoming month.
