We certainly felt winter recently. The weather gave us the old one-two punch, several times! Absolutely freezing cold, and then snow and ice, multiple storms....We even had to cancel or postpone a number of events. Enough already! At least, we have passed Tu B'Shevat, and we can look forward to warmer days, and the beginning of the budding of the trees soon.

RECENT EVENTS

We had a lovely Tu B'Shevat service on January 30th (in spite of the snow!), with participation by many people. It was also our Social Action Committee Social and Environmental Justice celebration. Thanks to all who attended and participated, and to Rachel Dash and Cookie Glasser for making it happen.

All of our usual classes continued (Torah Study, Jewish Literature, Death Chatter, the Judaism course, Torah at 10, Talmud at 10, and A Bisell Torah), and the Winter semester OLLI course, Jewish Poetry of Yehudah Amichai ran from February 5th to February 19th.

February 13th was Sisterhood's NCJW Reproductive Rights Shabbat service, again with participation by many. Thanks to Ina Angel for recruiting all those participants.

February 20th was Religion & Science Shabbat with the theme Truth Matters. It was also the night of "Shabbat Shuffle," a program for people in the Jewish community to mingle in small groups for a Shabbat meal.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Notwithstanding our debilitating winter weather over the last month, we have had a very exciting and rewarding series of events at Temple Israel. For me, the highlights have been our two special Shabbat services. One was the Social Action Tu B'Shevat service. The second was the NCJW Reproductive Rights Shabbat. The common denominators of both services were that they embodied the ethic of Reform Judaism of *Tikkun Olam* and also involved multiple members and invitees being able to participate from the pulpit. Emphasis on what makes Reform Judaism unique and active participation from different individuals can only help maintain Temple Israel as a thriving congregation.

Temple Israel and B'nai Jacob Synagogue sponsored Elon Gilad from Israel as a scholar in residence for two events on Wednesday, February 25th - a public event at the University of Charleston and earlier on the 25th for the Jewish Communities to share lunch at the Olive Tree Restaurant in South Charleston. Both Rabbi Blair and Rabbi Berman are very familiar with the scholarly works of Elon Gilad, and were excited about his coming to Charleston to share his wealth of knowledge.

As for our ongoing discussions with B'nai Jacob regarding consolidation, we have a meeting of the leadership of both Congregations scheduled for March 3rd to discuss financial issues, including a preliminary look at a joint budget after consolidation. I will continue to use


